

What to look for when hiring an Organic Landscaper

Ten Core Concepts of OLC From the Rutgers Organic Land Care Best Management Practices Manual

- 1."Do no harm" by protecting the natural elements of a site
- 2. Treating the landscape as a whole living system
- 3. Reducing energy, water, and material inputs
- 4. Practicing the law of return, such as returning grass clippings back to the lawn
- 5. <u>Promoting soil health which translates to healthy plants</u>



Ten Core Concepts of OLC From the Rutgers Organic Land Care Best Management Practices Manual

- 6. Fertilizing with naturally-occurring materials to supply essential nutrients as indicated by a soil test
- 7. <u>Favoring cultural practices over chemical applications</u> <u>for managing pests and diseases</u>
- 8. Avoiding the use of prohibited materials
- 9. Encouraging biodiversity and avoiding monocultures
- 10. Running an organic business with honesty and integrity

Land care vs. Landscape

- Stewardship or caring for the land
- Paradigm shift
 - •Remove or change the cause of the problem
- It is not a product swap
- Supports and utilizes natural plant systems
 - •Natural and organic inputs stimulate soil biology
 - Native plants attract diverse insect populations
- •Team Member/ Applicator and Client health

- Doesn't mean that you don't care
 - It means you don't recognize
- "Issues can NOT be solved with bag, box or bottle" (Chip Osbourne)
- It is not a product swap
- By passes natural systems
 - Nutrients are made available artificially by synthetic materials

Greater risk of exposer for all parties
















What to look for when hiring an Organic Landscaper

- Essential to understand that organic land care methods will not suit everyone's taste or philosophy
- As the consumer, need to be honest with yourself and genuinely invested in working towards a more ecologically responsible landscape.
- The company or practitioner you seek will also need to be 100% invested.
- Alignment between the consumer and the organic practitioner is vital

- 6) BE OPEN TO PAYING MORE.
- 7) BEWARE OF GREEN WASHING
